Hot Topic

Can Bloom's or Webb's DOK help identify Differentiated Learning?

Simple answer - YES! By having content evaluated against Bloom's or another learning taxonomy such as Webb's Depth of Knowledge (DOK) can provide great added value for a publisher in that you can prescribe different activities that address the same concept or standard.

The Bloom's taxonomy is a hierarchy of questions that get more and more complex. It is usually depicted as a triangle with six levels. The complex questions are at the top with the simple knowledge questions at the bottom. The six levels of questions: 1. Knowledge, Remembering; 2. Comprehension, Understanding; 3. Application, Applying; 4. Analysis, Analyzing; 5. Synthesis, Evaluating; 6. Evaluation, Creating.

Bloom's taxonomy breaks down the critical thinking skills into different levels. The higher up on the triangle, the more difficult the skill. Basic recall of knowledge is the easiest. Judging whether a character made the correct decision would be far more difficult. The higher order thinking skills that teachers want students to achieve is at the top three sections of the triangle: analysis, synthesis and evaluation. sis, and evaluation.

Many publishers do not have their content evaluated against Bloom's or DOK and could be missing a large opportunity for marketing content as addressing differentiation in the classroom. Demonstration of content mapped to different levels of learning and aligned to standards allows a teacher to not only ensure that he/she is addressing each standard, but provides a way to meet the diverse learning needs in the classroom. This graphic from the Curriculum Matrix® shows how EdGate can correlate content to standards but also provide a way to group the content by the assigned Bloom's level.

Common Core Update: To date, the following 24 states have adopted the Common Core standards - Arizona, Arkansas, Connecticut, Georgia, Hawaii, Illinois, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Michigan, Mississippi, Missouri, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Jersey, North Carolina, Ohio, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, West Virginia, Wisconsin, and Wyoming.

States are reviewing the final standards this summer to evaluate the integration into their curriculum and to develop timelines to implement. Accordingly, in line with federal guidelines, states may alter no more than 15 percent of the standards, which are flexible enough to allow states to add things they feel are particularly important to them. The plan is to start using the new standards in the 2012-13 school year which allows time to develop new tests aligned with their curriculum. We'll keep you posted of any new developments.
