### Hot Topic

#### Social and Emotional Learning Skills

The Washoe County School District of Nevada strives to raise its high school graduation rate to 90 percent by 2020. The district implemented a strategic plan in 2010 to help reach this goal. Teaching soft skills is one of the measures the new plan will implement. Until recently, it has been difficult to gauge how skills such as decision making affect academic success including graduation rates.



With the passage of the Every Student Succeeds Act, states are required to include at least one measure other than test scores in their accountability systems. Eight urban districts, including Washoe County, have committed to implementing comprehensive social-emotional learning practices for students in elementary, middle, and high schools allowing researchers from the American Institutes for Research to measure their results. Each district has adapted administrative policies to integrate the new practices. Federal grants and assistance from CASEL, the Collaborative for Academic, Social, and Emotional Learning, will support teachers, students, and administrators in working together to develop data that could change how social and emotional skills are implemented in classrooms across the country.

## State Highlight

### New York's Opt-out Movement

With testing season in full swing the state of New York's education policy is once again in the news as [the opt-out movement](#) protests the current system of standardized testing for students in grades 3-8. [The exponential growth of the opt-out movement](#) in the last few years has led to changes in the tests themselves, but consensus from the movement is that those changes are not nearly enough. [More than 220,000 students opted out of the state tests last year](#) and that number is expected to grow this year. Education officials have been trying to quell the dissidence by touting the efforts made to revamp the current tests. Governor Cuomo has promised more changes to come with the standards themselves, the assessments and the teacher evaluation system. The movement claims they will not be swayed and will continue to have their children opt-out until the promised changes are enacted. All eyes are on New York as the movement is expected to gain momentum in other states as well as they are debating the fate of their Common Core standards and assessments. Stay tuned as we will be watching to see what happens!

## EdGate Services

### EdGate and IMS Global

EdGate has now been added to the IMS Global GUID Provider Registry. What does this mean for EdGate clients?

First, a little background information. Common Cartridge is a specification that describes the format for creating and sharing educational digital content, namely across Learning Management Systems (LMS). The specification was developed by IMS Global Learning Consortium and describes in detail the packaging format and infrastructure needed to support the format for presentation to the end-user. If an EdGate client has created Common Cartridge objects that also include standards alignment data (standards GUIDs), the client can include a Provider ID of "EG" to denote that the standards GUID came from EdGate. Someone using that object could use EdGate's EDR service to look up the context of the standard, or if they are an existing customer, use the alignments in their own system and display the correct standards data. The goal is to create easy interoperability of alignment data. The information may be used in constructing Common Cartridges v1.2.
